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Re: Summer visit and Sample Collection

Summary of lab data:

- *Tees and Fairways look good. I do see a difference between Western Tee #6 and the others, but you may know why that is. It isn't enough to make recommendations different- maybe I caught more sod in that sample.*
 - *On the greens, the data was good as well. I would recommend a 2 pounds of product per 1,000 square feet rate of 0-0-50 through the Summer.*
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Dear Nate,

You run very consistent programs and it shows. I don't remember the last time I made a visit and saw a real issue. The water makes all the difference. Keep track of what goes on around you. We would like to think that you will never have to use a different water source. If it did change to a reclaimed water things would go side ways quickly and your programs would have to change drastically. Having this data collected over the last 4 years- and continuing- would help with that because we will know what to do. I am sure it won't happen soon, but if it does it will happen fast!

Your motto of "never miss a day" keeps the course conditions consistent from season to season. This may be the most stressful time of year to grow grass, but you do a great job of setting the table for Summer with work you do in Winter and Spring. The only addition I would make to the greens is routine 0-0-50 at the above recommended rate. The only adjustment I would make to the tees and fairways is to find a product such as "Blast" or pHacid" to regularly acidify the soil and access free mineral nutrition. It is easy to add into most spray tank mixes and really works in "heavier" soils like your's.
